Additional course topics include Recognition of Fall Hazards in Construction and General Industry; Basic Fall Prevention and Protection Planning; Fall Protection Systems; Fall Protection Anchorage; Fall Protection Connectors; Personal Fall Arrest Equipment; and, Inspection, Care, and Maintenance of Fall Protection Equipment.
